



Bee Lines.....

Write a story or poem about bees.

Here are some idea triggers:

1. 'There's a bee at the bottom of my garden. Its name is....

This could be a starting point for your story or poem.

Think about what the bee will see and do when it lives and flies around in your garden.

What other creatures might it meet?

What adventures will it have?

2.Acrostic poems: use the first letter of a special word for the beginning of each line of your poem. The first word of each line should start with a capital letter. When you have finished your poem the capital letters should show the special word when they are read down the page.

Some special words for bees are:

NECTAR DRONES QUEEN HONEY POLLEN WORKERS HIVE

Find out why these words are special to bees.

When you do your research about bees you will find other words that you could use.

2. HAIKUS:

A haiku is a traditional Japanese poem containing 17 syllables, often accompanied by a drawing.

They are usually arranged in 3 lines.

Examples of syllables: door (1) water (2) performance (3) familiar (4)

Examples of haiku poems:

'The dew drops glitter
As a passing robin shakes
them
Then they are gone'

'Spider on the twig
What a beautiful web you spin
Diamonds settling'.

Try to write a Haiku about bees.
